

PC 832 Arrest, Search & Seizure

COURSE DESCRIPTION

PC 832 Arrest, Search and Seizure: This course satisfies the arrest, search, and seizure requirement for peace officers as defined in section 832 of the California Penal Code. Topics include professionalism, ethics, the criminal justice system, policing in the community, laws of evidence and arrest, investigation, cultural diversity/discrimination, use of force, and arrest and control. This course is Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) certified. Pass/No Pass only.

Upon successful completion of this course, all students will receive 2 units and a digital SRPSTC Certificate of Completion. In-service peace officers may also be eligible for CA POST/STC credit, depending on agency requirements.

IMPORTANT

All students must submit a Medical Clearance letter/form prior to the start of the course, and must be 18 years of age or older. Clearance letters must be no older than 6 months prior to the last day of the class.

As this is a P.O.S.T Certified, Basic Law Enforcement Course, attendance is legislatively mandated (students cannot miss any hours in this class by law). On the first day of class, students are required to arrive at 7:30am in order to complete the registration process and avoid impeding instructional time. Late students who miss this process will not be allowed to attend the course
